## Freedom of Information Act 2000 Request Fixed Penalty Notices Dog Control

I refer to your FOI request received 16 November and respond as follows:

## Request

- Out of the 1280, £75 fixed penalty notices issued by DC&SDC, how many of these have paid £75 to DC&SDC, in the period 1st January 2017 to present?
- Out of the 1280, £75 fixed penalty notices issued by DC&SDC, how many of these have paid the reduced fee £50, in the period 1st January 2017 to
- Out of the 1280, £75 fixed penalty notices issued by DC&SDC, how many £75 fines have been waived by DC&SDC, in the period 1st January 2017 to present?
- Out of the 1280, £75 fixed penalty notices issued by DC&SDC, how may Dog Licence owners have been prosecuted for non-payment of the £75 fine, in the period 1st January 2017 to present?

## Response

- 43
- 391 34 waived and 357 cancelled (dog no longer present)
- 4 for no licence (to date) 4 for other FPNs issued (to date)
