The church meets every Sunday at 10.30am for worship. People can stay for a cup of tea, coffee and a chat after the service. The church has a dedicated "City Kids" programme for kids aged 6 months to 11 years old.

The Hope Centre initiative has been adapting to meet the current cost of living crisis. They offer money management courses through CAP Money (Christians Against Poverty), work with Life NI to offer a pregnancy support centre, as well as other services (clothing bank, shower and laundry services and a drop in cafe). There is also a supply of baby equipment for those who need it.

The Cafe is currently open from 11am to 1.30pm on a Wednesday and operates as a drop-in centre for those wanting a cup of coffee and a chat. Vegetables are sourced through Fareshare (www.fareshare.org.uk) and soup is also served free on Wednesdays. The Food Bank/Social Supermarket is available on Wednesdays from 11.00am-13.30pm.

#### **Emergency Healthcare**

**Phone First** is a new service which is being trialled across a number of Emergency Departments (ED) in Northern Ireland, improving patient safety and reducing the risk of COVID-19 infection and transmission.

The Phone First service is designed for patients who are feeling unwell and considering travelling to an ED with an injury or illness which requires urgent treatment but is not immediately life threatening. See below for participating departments:

For all emergencies that are life threatening always call 999 immediately. This can include: Stroke, heart attack, loss of consciousness, breathing difficulties, severe bleeding or major trauma.

#### **GP Out of Hours Service**

The best place to deal with your urgent but non-critical medical matters, or to discuss any ongoing treatment, is your local GP practice.

The GP Out of Hours Service is for people who need urgent medical treatment but cannot wait until their doctor's practice opens. GP out of hours' service is available from 6.00 pm during the week until your GP surgery opens the next morning, as well as 24 hours on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.

Attendance at GP Out of Hours is by appointment only, please call first on: 028 7186 5195

The doctor or nurse will tell you if you need to see a doctor or refer you to another service. If necessary, an appointment will be given to attend one of the Out of Hours GP locations at Altnagelvin, Limavady, Strabane, Omagh or Enniskillen.
